

SCHOOL RULES

Observance of the following is compulsory for all students and deviations will lead to disciplinary action.

- Self-discipline is the forte of the school.
- The school begins at 08:50 a.m. All students are expected to reach school before the bell rings.
- After the bell the school gates will be closed. Disciplinary action will be taken against those who are habitually late.
- School uniform is a discipline in itself and should be adhered by all students.
- Students are expected to wear the school uniform in a proper manner as specified by the school.
- Changing classrooms between periods should be done in silence and in an orderly manner.
- Students are advised to keep their classrooms / school building / campus neat and clean. Waste material and leftovers must be thrown into the dustbins only.
- Students should observe polite civil behaviour. Shouting, bullying or use of foul language is forbidden.
- Hair must be trimmed at regular intervals.
- Nails must be trimmed. No nail polish or mehandi is allowed. Attendance on all days of observation in school is compulsory.

CODE OF CONDUCT

The following undesirable behaviour/repeated indiscipline will lead to serious consequences even leading to expulsion, if not corrected:

- >> Damaging school furniture, fixtures / building or things belonging to others
- Writing or drawing anything on the walls / school furniture / library books/ washroom, etc.
- Bringing costly or undesirable articles to school like, Cameras, Cell Phones, Smart Watches, Gold Ornaments, etc.
- Whenever students represent the school or come beyond working hours for school related activities such as games, rehearsal, extra classes etc. they must be in full school uniform.
- To keep leave for half a day to a minimal as far as possible. In case of an emergency, written permission must be taken from the Principal / Vice Principal / Headmistress and the Class Teacher. In case a child leaves the school early it is mandatory to sign the register and take the child alongwith.

- Scribbling or writing anything on the school uniform?
- Bullying or using any form of physical/emotional violence against a fellow student or any member of the staff.
- Bursting crackers or throwing colour on one another within or near the school premises.
- ▶ Using unfair means during a test / examination.

ATTENDANCE

- 1. As per CBSE Examination Bylaws, 80% attendance is mandatory to be eligible for appearing in annual examination, failing which, no relaxation will be given in this regard.
- 2. Leave must be taken with prior written sanction. Strict action will be taken against those students who remain absent for more than 3 days without any formal intimation to the school.
- 3. Medical Fitness Certificate is necessary in case of illness even for a day's absence.
- 4. Absence from school should be discouraged. There is no provision for short/half day leave for student in general. However in case of any emergency, the parent of the student is requested to send a written application and meet the school authority personally.
- 5. A student suffering from any infectious disease can rejoin school only after the completion of the quarantine period, certified by a Registered Medical Practitioner.

ABSENCE FROM EXAMINATION

If a child is absent without prior information then he/she will be marked absent for that particular paper.

If the child has joined in mid-session, then the assessment of the child will be based on the tests he/she has appeared in.

WITHDRAWAL

Parents desirous of withdrawing their wards Transfer Certificate from the school should give requisition letter to the School. Transfer Certificate shall be issued within 30 days of application, subject to the clearance of all dues including return of library books.

LEAVE RULES

- 1. Leave up to 3 days or more than 3 days should be sanctioned prior to proceeding on leave or within the period of leave. A leave application signed by the parent should be submitted. All applications must be routed through the class teacher.
- 2. In case of default, students will be marked absent and after 5 days of absence his/her name will be struck off from the School Register.
- 3. Leave for more than a week will be granted in genuine cases only and it should be applied for with authentic record at least 7 days before.
- 4. A student returning from medical leave will be allowed to attend the class only on the production of a fitness certificate.

FEE COLLECTION

School fees for students who pay in cash/online will be collected through between 01st to 10 th both the days inclusive) of April / July / October and December month between 9:00 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. All the students from Classes Nursery to X, XII are required to clear the fees up to March, in the month of December itself.

Students who fail to deposit the fees in a particular term will have to clear their arrears along with an additional fine of 100 rupees per month.
